PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS IN 2019

The staff of Oatley West Public School collaboratively work together to make decisions about the placement of students in their next year's group. During this time many varied considerations are taken into account to ensure the best mix for each class. If you have a particular request for placement of your child or children based on a *specific learning need*, it is asked that you submit a letter addressed to Mrs Chappell (Deputy Principal) at the office by COB this Friday 17 November 2019. (Please note that requests for particular teachers are not appropriate and all requests must be submitted in writing to the office only). Include child's name, current class, request and reason for request. All requests will be considered but there is no guarantee that requests can be met, as there are many contributing factors in preparing class lists. Requests will be for the 2019 year only. Please be reassured that all classes are structured to provide the best possible learning outcomes for students both academically and socially. Decisions about student placement are made using a wide range of information gathered throughout the year, including teacher anecdotal records. Requests will not be considered at the beginning of Term 1 in the following year unless the principal considers there are mitigating circumstances. Please note that generally class structures cannot be finalised until the total school enrolments are known in the following year and usually Week 2, of Term 1. It is with professionalism that staff consider class structures, which are formed in the best interests of ALL students and the school. We thank you for your support, and understanding.


VALUES LEAF ASSEMBLY

Many thanks to our school banking Grand Parents and Mums, Faith S, Hazel S and Jennifer L for helping with school banking last Thursday. Your efforts are greatly appreciated!

FAQ's

Still waiting for my prize. It's been 2 weeks.....

We don't keep school banking prizes at OWPS. They are ordered online and sent via post to our school. As we near Christmas, Aus Post becomes very busy and we are seeing prizes arriving 3 to 4 weeks after making the initial order.

My eldest is leaving OWPS at the end of this year but wants to continue with school banking....

As long as your child has a younger sibling at OWPS, then yes, they can continue to bank at this school. Just add their bank deposit book together with their brothers or sisters bank book each Thursday's as usual.

Also works the other way, if you have a younger child that hasn't started school but their brother or sister has and they want to start banking.

How can I check to see if my child's money has been banked?

If you don't want to wait 6 months to review all deposit made from your child's statement, then I suggest downloading the 'CommBank' app.

As a parent and signatory to your child's account, your able to view, move money into and out of your child's account.

All you need is a NetBank client number.

Generally it takes 24 hours before money deposited at school banking shows up on the app/ account.
