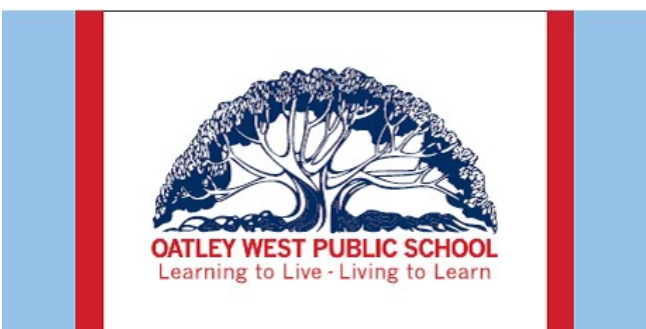

STAGE 3 FETE DAY



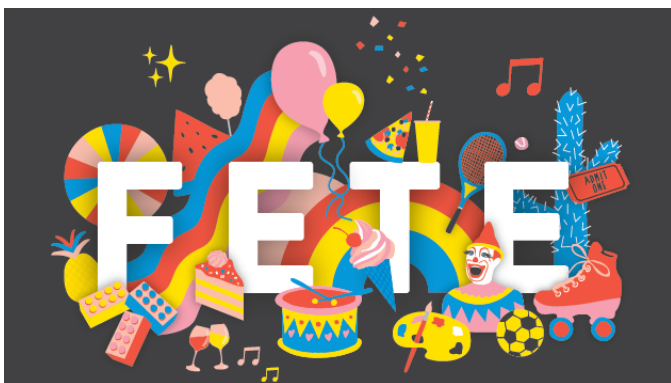
Our School Fete Day is tomorrow! There will be a variety of fun activities run by the Stage 3 students.

This will be the last week (WK 7) to borrow books from our Library. Next week (WK 8), all books need to be returned for our Stocktake, which begins in Week 9.

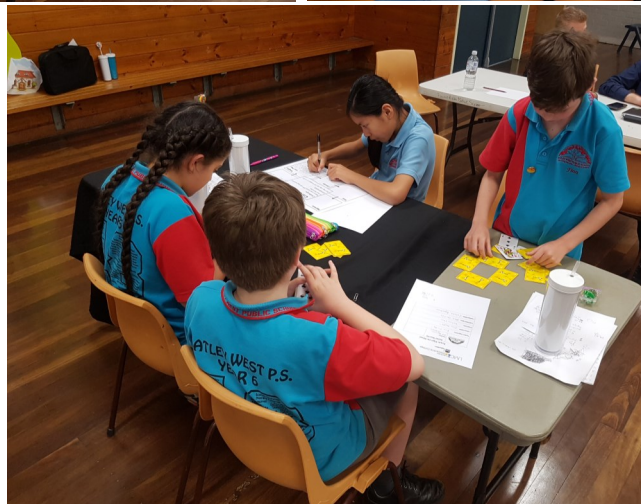
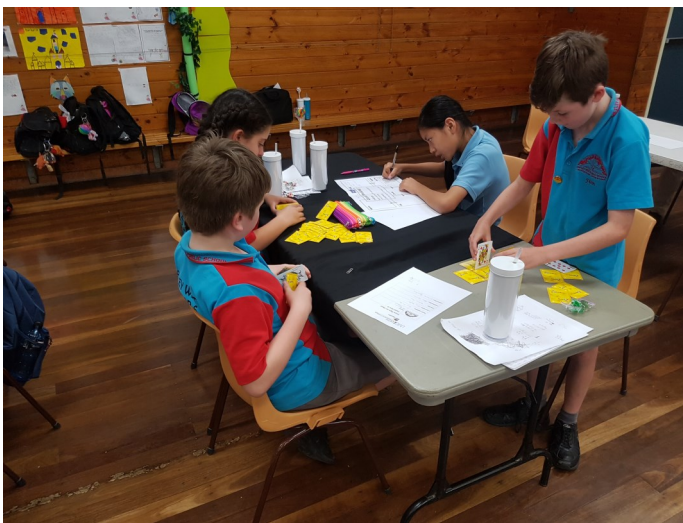

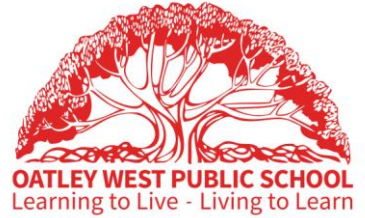
