SWIMMING CARNIVAL

The annual Oatley West Public School Swimming Carnival will be held this Wednesday 21st February at Carrs Park Olympic Swimming Pool. Thank you for all the parents who have volunteered their time. We have had an overwhelming response by parents and carers wanting to help. We will not require assistance from everyone and notes have been distributed to those parents who have been selected to help.

A note to Year 2 students will be sent home today. A significant amount of Year 2 students have returned their Swimming Carnival permission note, indicating they are Non/Poor Swimmers. As indicated in the original permission note and in the school newsletter, there are very limited opportunities for Non/Poor swimmers at the carnival. Novelty events and the 25m assisted swim may be cancelled due to time constraints. Year 2 students who are 8 (or who are turning 8 this year) will only be able attend if they can confidently swim 50 metres unassisted and are wanting to compete competitively at the District level. If you have indicated your child is a Non/Poor swimmer, unfortunately they will be unable to attend the carnival.

If your child is interested in competing in the 200m medley at district level, please submit a qualifying time. Please note that this event is usually suited to experienced squad swimmers. Only the fastest 4 times from the entire District will compete at the district carnival. Please submit this to Miss Ross no later than Friday 23rd February. Entries submitted after this date will not be accepted.

Unisex Sport Shorts: These shorts are currently being sold to all girls and Kindy students. Boys requiring Size 6 Sport Shorts will also be sold the new shorts. All other sizes in Boys Sport Shorts will continue to be sold until all stock is sold.

KEEP PROTECTED FROM THE SUN

Children should ensure they are protected from the sun i.e. sun block, t-shirts, hats etc. Sunscreen should be applied on a regular basis throughout the day. T-shirts and hats must be worn when not competing and water needs to be consumed regularly.

Note: Due to new regulations, children will not be permitted to dive off the starting blocks because of the height above the water. They will have to dive from the edge of the pool. At the shallow end, diving will not be permitted at all. Children will be standing in the pool before they start swimming.



Benefits of school banking

Children engaged in school banking learn a very important life skill.

Saving their pocket money each week and watching their balance grow is a very rewarding experience that will follow them well after their time at OWPS.

The Dollarmites program teaches children through regular savings the patience that's required when saving for a goal. For every 10 deposits made, they are rewarded by qualifying for a bank prize. Every term there are two new prizes to choose from.

Do you plan to have your child use a mobile phone when they start high school?

If yes then encourage them to start saving now. If your child is in Kindy then saving for a phone will only require \$5 per week (40 weeks in NSW school year X 7 years in primary school)

By the end of Year 6 they will have saved \$1400. Enough to buy a decent phone and cover! A child in year 6 with no savings will need to save \$35 per week to save \$1400.00
