REMEMBRANCE DAY



Remembrance Day is held on the 11th of November – the 11th day of the 11th month of the year.

A two minute silence is always held at 11am to remember the millions who have died at war.

Remembrance Day was first held in 1919, one year after World War 1 ended. This day is also known as Armistice Day, which is the original name to mark the day World

War 1 ended. It is now known as Remembrance Day to remember all the people who have died since World War 1.

Poppies are worn on Remembrance Day because they are the flowers which grew all over the battlefields.

Many people wear a sprig of rosemary on Remembrance Day and on ANZAC Day. Since ancient times this aromatic herb has been recognised as a sign of remembrance and loyalty. For Australians, rosemary is even more significant as this plant grows wild on the Gallipoli peninsula, serving as another reminder of the ANZAC troops who lost their lives there.

On Remembrance Day, flags are flown at half-mast from 10.30am to 11.03am as a sign of mourning and respect.

The Unknown Soldier is intended to represent all men killed during war, especially those with no known resting place. The original Unknown Soldier was entombed at Westminster Abbey in London on Remembrance Day 1920. On the same day, France entombed an Unknown Soldier below the Arc de Triomphe.

It was not until Remembrance Day in 1993 that Australia laid to rest an Unknown Soldier in the Hall of Memory at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra. At his side was a bayonet and a golden sprig of wattle. The soldier was buried in a coffin made from Tasmanian Blackwood which was scattered with soil from the French battlefield, Pozières. The SRC Seniors and I visited this memorial a few weeks ago when we were in Canberra.



It is estimated that over 60,000 Australians died in the Great War, many of these have no known graves. This left the Western Front dotted with memorials and cemeteries commemorating the fallen. Many Australians travel to these locations, as well as others in Egypt and Turkey, to pay tribute to the events that occurred, and to remember all who served and fell there.

We must always remember these people who sacrificed their lives to make Australia the great country it is today, and also today, we stop to remember and to thank all those Australians that are still fighting in peacekeeping roles in many countries throughout the world. Many thanks to Mr Waugh and Senior SRC representatives for presenting a very moving ceremony this morning.

Volunteers wanted: Currently, Uniform Shop only has a few regular volunteers who help. If you have a spare hour on Thursday mornings from 9-10am, please consider volunteering at the Uniform Shop. Whether it's once a fortnight, month or term, all help is greatly appreciated. **NB:** A free Volunteers Working with Children check will be required if you wish to volunteer.

Plastic Bag Fee – Although we are endeavouring to be plastic bag free, orders will incur a \$0.25 charge where a plastic bag is required to deliver uniform to your child. This fee will automatically be added to your payment. If payment is made by cash or cheque, please ensure this fee is added to your payment.

Uniform Orders: Order forms (dated July 2019) can be completed and dropped in to Letterbox 8 located in the front courtyard. Please note, orders are <u>not</u> accepted via e-mail. All orders will be delivered to your child's classroom on Thursday when the shop is open, provided they are received prior to 9.30am on Thursday. The preferred payment method for orders is by Credit Card or Cheque as we cannot be held accountable for lost cash/orders. Cards are generally debited one day prior to delivery.

We take great pride in the appearance of the children at Oatley West Public School and encourage all students to wear the correct school uniform.

SCHOOL BANKING

Many thanks to the wonderful parents, Faith S, Vicky G and Tina Y who volunteered to process School banking deposits last Thursday.

How much money has school banking generated for OWPS this year?

Students banking at OWPS have raised \$2120.00 for 2019 and we still have one more payment pending in December.

Who and where did this money come from?

It's called the Regular Saver's Contribution Payment, an incentive payment rewarding consistent savers, paid by the Commonwealth Bank to our school.

CBA pays OWPS \$5 every time a student makes 10 deposits regardless of the amount deposited.

That's a total payment from CBA of \$20 to every student, who deposits their pocket money every week for the year!

What other benefits does school banking offer?

Learning to save when they are young can empower them for success in the future by seeing their savings grow over time!
