### NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING AND VIOLENCE.

The national definition of bullying for Australian schools says:

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders.

Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

At Oatley West Public School, we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

You are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

### If your child talks to you about bullying:

Listen calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.

Reassure your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'.

Ask your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.

**Visit** <a href="www.bullyingnoway.gov.au">www.bullyingnoway.gov.au</a> to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practise strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.

Contact the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.

Check in regularly with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

If you are looking for support for yourself to deal with a bullying situation, you will find ideas on the Bullying. No Way! website for parents. As well, please feel free to contact the school if you would like to discuss any aspect of our approach to preventing bullying.

Unfortunately our *Bullying No Way* wrist bands did not arrive in time and should be delivered early this week. We will encourage all students to wear their wristbands to school as a reminder of the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence. Years 1-6 received a Pocket Card with student tips about bullying.

Our thoughts are with the people of New Zealand after the tragedy that has shocked us all as well as being deeply confronting. We met as a staff this morning to discuss our own wellbeing and that of our students and community as they arrive at school today. Some of our students may not have watched the extensive media coverage, while other students may have watched the media's response for many hours. Teachers will be monitoring their class throughout the day and following weeks to support wellbeing and to answer questions if/when they arise. Please be conscious of news and media reports in the home. Children may not be directly watching the television news reports but may still be taking in the content.

Our schools provide a safe and supportive environment for all staff and students. We are proud that our schools embrace diversity, tolerance and acceptance of all.

We know the reasons behind terror incidents like the one at Christchurch are varied and complex. As a community we need to be sensitive to people's feelings about this incident; look out for each other and let someone know if you are worried about anything or anyone.

Winter Uniform: Winter Uniform is not yet available for over the counter sales and is not worn until the day after Mother's Day (13<sup>th</sup> May). In the interim, we encourage all parents to place a separate order for winter uniform. Orders placed, will be given priority, prior to winter uniform going on sale over the counter. Uniform Shop cannot guarantee stock availability if your order is not placed in advance as some stock can take between 8 to 12 weeks to arrive.

Plastic Bag Fee – Although we are endeavouring to be plastic bag free, orders will now incur a \$0.25 charge where a plastic bag is required to deliver uniform to your child. This fee will automatically be added to your payment. If payment is made by cash or cheque, please ensure this fee is added to your payment.

Uniform Orders: Order forms (dated January 2019) can be completed and dropped in to Letterbox 8 located in the front courtyard. Please note, orders are <u>not</u> accepted via e-mail. All orders will be delivered to your child's classroom on Thursday when the shop is open, provided they are received prior to 9.30am on Thursday. The preferred payment method for orders is by Credit Card or Cheque as we cannot be held accountable for lost cash/orders. Cards are generally debited one day prior to delivery. We take great pride in the appearance of the children at Oatley West Public School and encourage all students to wear the correct school uniform.

# School Banking FAQ's Checking account balances

School Banking Co-ordinators are not permitted to check account balances. The child's parent or guardian holds the authority on the child's account and only they can access the balance of the child's account.

### Combining tokens with other children

This is referred to as token "pooling" and is not permitted. The program focuses on rewarding individual savings behaviour.

### Redeeming reward items

For each deposit made at school students will receive a silver Dollarmites token. Once they have collected 10 tokens they can redeem them for a School Banking reward item. There are rewards to appeal to kids of all primary school ages. Reward items have staggered release dates throughout the year and are only available once they are released and while stocks last.
