RUOK Day -'There is more to say after R U O K!'



This Thursday we will be learning how to support our peers and to talk about how they are feeling. This is certainly an important life lesson for everyone. Looking out for one another and lending support is a key life skill for any age group. The awareness of RUOK includes themes such as: friendships, respectful relationships, help-seeking, mental health and wellbeing.

Children cannot be expected to fix someone's problems, nor know the best way to help and support. However, they can be encouraged to listen to what their friend is saying, let them know they care and tell a teacher, school counsellor or trusted adult if they are worried about their friend.

By promoting an environment of positive peer support and accessing support channels via an adult, children can learn that asking, 'Are you OK?', is a key life skill.

R U OK? has 4 Conversation Steps to help navigate a conversation when someone says, "No, I'm not OK".

These steps are:

- 1 Ask
- 2 Listen
- 3 Encourage action
- 4 Check in

We continue to maintain strict hygiene protocols, with everyone washing hands thoroughly, the use of hand sanistiser in every room, staff maintaining physical distancing and everyone staying at home when they are unwell. As mentioned in previous newsletters,

Missing school means your child misses out on vital information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver, you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- is sick, or has an infectious illness. In accordance with advice from NSW Health,
 parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell,
 even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Students and staff with flu-like
 symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test
 result and be symptoms free before being permitted to return to school.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to Miss Aravanopoulos or the school counsellor.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please either tell your child's teacher or the office, contact the school via Skool Bag or explain the reason by phone, email, or write a note as soon as possible and within seven days.






